# LONG TERM INTERNSHIP EVALUATION AND VIVA VOCE

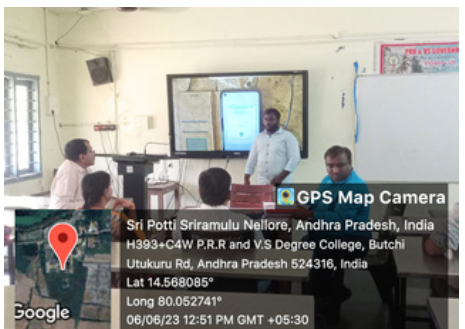
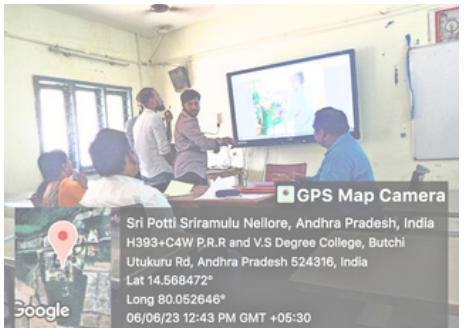
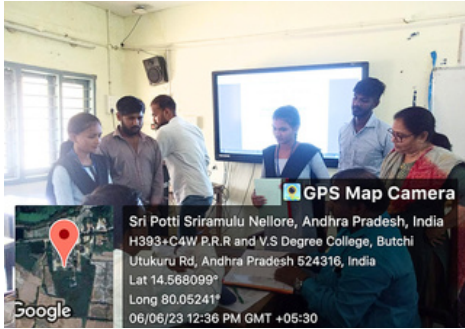

They work on real-world projects and tasks to gain practical experience in their chosen fields. **Viva Voce Examination:** After successfully completing their Long Term Internships, the students undergo a Viva Voce examination. All the above mentioned tasks and responsibilities are entrusted to the below mentioned teams and the Principal is to monitor day to day progress of admissions.

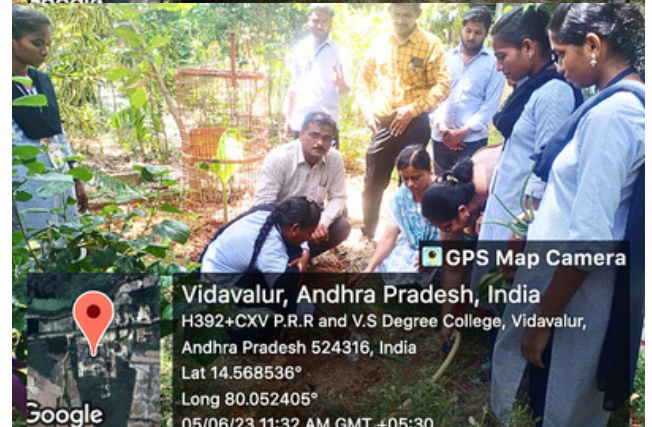


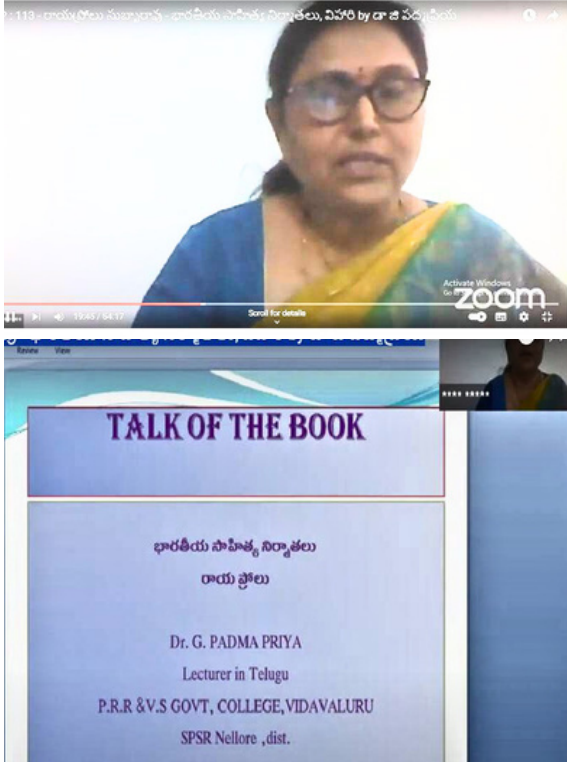

## MOU WITH BRAHMAS ACADEMY



The Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) between PRR&VS Govt. College and Brahmas Academy establishes a collaborative Internship Programme for students pursuing Online Internship classes. The primary objectives of the MOU are to provide students with practical exposure to real-world work environments, enhance their professional development through guided training and mentorship, and foster strong industry-academia relationships.



The Internship Programme will offer eligible students the opportunity to gain hands-on experience for a duration of 6 or 8 weeks, during which they will work on meaningful projects under the supervision of experienced professionals from the Partner Organization/Company.
