Community Service

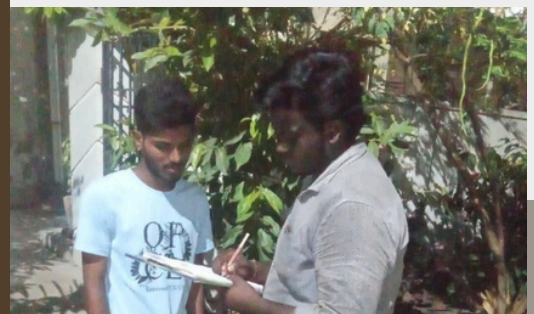
As part of the academic curriculum introduced by the Commissionerate of Collegiate Education (CCE), the students of PRR & VS Government College, Vidavalur, participated in the Community Service Project (CSP) during the academic year 2025–2026. This project was designed to bridge the gap between classroom learning and societal realities by engaging students in meaningful community-based activities. Importantly, this project was part of their academic evaluation, and marks were awarded based on their participation, reporting, and involvement.

Students were each assigned a socially relevant topic and conducted field-level surveys under the supervision of faculty mentors. The project enabled them to interact directly with communities, collect data, and reflect upon real-world challenges, thereby enhancing their problem-solving and research skills.

One of the key themes covered was Zero Poverty, through which students gained insight into the financial conditions of families in nearby communities. They understood the causes and effects of poverty and observed the impact of welfare schemes intended for poverty alleviation.

Another significant topic was Skilling and Employment, where students examined local employment trends, skill gaps, and access to vocational training. This experience provided them with an understanding of how skill development contributes to sustainable livelihoods and economic empowerment.

Under the topic Population Management and Human Rights, students explored how population growth influences access to basic rights such as education, healthcare, and housing. They interacted with families to gather perspectives on reproductive health, public awareness, and the role of human rights in daily life.





Community Service

Students working on Water Security assessed the availability and quality of water in both households and public sources. They analyzed water usage patterns and promoted awareness about water conservation and sustainable practices in their survey areas.

In the Farmer Agri-Tech segment, students interacted with local farmers to understand their knowledge and usage of modern agricultural tools and technologies. This topic exposed students to the realities of rural livelihoods and the challenges faced by farmers in adapting to technological innovations.

The Swachh Andhra topic emphasized sanitation, cleanliness, and environmental awareness. Students observed waste management systems, hygiene practices, and cleanliness of public spaces. The project inspired both students and residents to work toward a cleaner and healthier environment.

Another forward-looking topic was Deep Tech – All Walks of Life, where students explored the community's awareness and usage of emerging technologies such as digital platforms, automation, and artificial intelligence. The findings helped students appreciate the growing role of technology in daily life and its relevance across all sectors.

Throughout the project, faculty mentors guided the students in preparing questionnaires, selecting appropriate methodologies, and compiling survey reports. Both online and printed formats were used for data collection to ensure better community reach and participation.

In conclusion, the Community Service Project was not only a graded academic activity but also a deeply engaging learning experience. It provided students with a practical understanding of societal challenges, encouraged them to become socially responsible citizens, and strengthened their academic and interpersonal skills. The project has left a lasting impact on their academic journey and personal growth.
