PREFACE

Pandit Jawaharlal Nehru considers educational institutions as **“Modern Temples of Learning”**. These institutions have contributed much to the intellectual growth of the society for generations together. In spite of the innumerable recommendations of the committees and commissions constituted after independence, education to majority of agrarian rural underprivileged remained a distant dream. Higher education remained the prerogative of the affluent. Thanks to the commitment of the government and the generosity of the philanthropists, the rustic first generation students are now knocking the portals of learning and making for themselves.

The Philanthropic gesture and generous donations of an area of 11.72 acres of land and Rs.2,00,000 in cash of the chief donors Mr.Ponnaluru Ramachandra Reddy and Ms.Venkata Subbamma resulted in the establishment of this Government College at Vidavalur on 8th July,1965 as composite college to cater to the educational needs of boys and girls belonging to the poorest of the poor and the downtrodden sections of the society. It is rightly named after the donors as **“Ponnaluru Ramachandra Reddy and Venkata Subbamma Government College”**, and is affiliated to Vikrama Simhapuri University, Nellore. At present, the institution is accredited with ‘B’ Grade by NAAC, Bangalore on 14th Sept. 2015.

Built in a sylvan atmosphere, P.R.R &V.S Govt. College is free from urban pollution. It is a boon to the students belonging to the marginalized sections of the district. Most of the students are first generation learners and hail from rural background, whose parents are largely illiterate.

INSTITUTIONAL DEVELOPMENT PLAN:

2.1. EXECUTIVE SUMMARY:

History:

PRR & VS Govt College was started as a composite co-education college in **1965**. It is located in **Vidavalur**, a remote rural area in **SPSR Nellore district**. It is the result of a Philanthropic gesture of the generous couple, Late **Sri Ponnaluru Ramachandra Reddy and Smt. Venkata Subbamma**, Landlords of Vidavalur. Right from the inception, till date the family has been showing very keen interest in the development of the college. From its humble beginnings in borrowed accommodation, today the college boasts of its own **permanent buildings constructed by the R & B department** in an ideal, sprawling pastoral location of about **12 acres, also gifted by the donors**.

Vision:

The prime vision of this institution is –

- To cater to the academic needs of the economically deprived, and socially down-trodden, emotionally dejected, disoriented and depressed and academically alienated (poverty – stricken) **rural youth**.
- To make them into self confident, purposeful, focused, and responsible citizens and knowledgeable man power with good character, comradeship, wisdom and self reliance with the motto **“Niyatham Kuru karmatvam Vidyamrutha Iha Bhavathi”**.

Mission:

- Designing and developing a curriculum of effective implementation,
- To infuse confidence in the social outcastes, to uplift their morale, to equip them academically with the challenges around,
- To make them more employable, and
- To bridge the yawning gaps between these rural under privileged and the fortunate urban folk in corporate college
- is the proclaimed mission of the institution.

Values of the Institution:

The institute envisages an overall intellectual and psychological development of the students and strives ambience is created with the teachers acting as facilitators. Sufficient scaffolding is provided to make the students confident, self reliant and positive in perspective.

The college was started as a composite college. It was bifurcated into Junior College and Degree College by the Government on 16 – 07 – 2003. Now the College is for UG students

only and has been functioning with a lot more concentration and focus on their academic requirements.

The College now offers instruction in the following Courses:

 - a) Mathematics, Physics and Chemistry (B.Sc – T.M)
 - b) Botany, Zoology, and Chemistry (B.Sc – T. M)
 - c) History, Economics and Politics (B.A – T.M)

 - d) Mathematics, Physics and Computer science – B.Sc (English Medium)
 - e) B.Com Computer applications – B.Com (English Medium)

Details of Affiliation:

This College was affiliated to Sri Venkateswara University right from its inception i.e. 1965-66 to 2010-11. Since 2010 - 11 onwards it has been affiliated to **VIKRAMA SIMHAPURI UNIVERSITY**, Nellore, Andhra Pradesh.

Progress of the Institution since Establishment:

This College was initially started in the campus of Z.P.High School, Vidavalur, Nellore Dist. with a few temporary class rooms with asbestos roofing. As the college grew in all dimensions, the present building was constructed in 1989. The Government of Andhra Pradesh decided to bifurcate the composite colleges in the state (1997) and therefore the intermediate courses were separated and shifted to new building in 2003. Now this college is offering only UG courses for the students strength of 275. After the bifurcation, the lecturers are able to devote their fully in imparting quality education to the students of B.A, B.Com, and B.Sc.

PRR & VS Govt. College is recognized under 2(f) and 12 (B) of UGC act since 1991. It is presently affiliated to **VIKRAMA SIMHAPURI UNIVERSITY**, Nellore, Andhra

Pradesh. The college is one of the **pioneers** in introducing restructured courses at UG level and has opted to start **5(five)** self funding courses in B.Sc (MPCs), B.Sc (Z.C & Ind. Fisheries)

B.Com (Comp &SP), B.Com (Computer Applications). These programmes provide ample Job opportunities. Even though there exists a great demand for these restructured courses, traditional courses like B.Sc (MPC), B.Sc (BZC) and B.A (HEP) are offered with an intention to accommodate the rural poor youth. Among these courses B.Sc (Fisheries), B.Com(General), BA (ESCA) are not functioning due to uneconomic strength. Currently five courses are running in the college.

Since its inception, the college has made significant progress in terms of educating thousands of students. As evidence in the alumni meets, many of the students have reached highest positions in various fields.

Infrastructure has been developed much to meet the demands of the recent past and needs extensive modernisation to suit the present day trends in teaching learning process. Slowly the college has been shifting from conventional course to need – based

Restructured courses

Academic growth/achievement:

The institution has grown as a centre of teaching-learning activity in which students are imparted with skills to sustain in the modern times

The college is situated in a rural area, where in agriculture and aquaculture are the main income sources. Majority of the students are first generation learners, hailing from nearby villages whose parents are mostly illiterates. As the trend is that intelligent cream of the students at the Intermediate level opts for Engineering and other professional courses, only average and financially poor students seek admissions into UG courses. Though their level of understanding is low, bridge courses, special orientation and coaching classes are conducted at the beginning of the academic year to raise such students to the required academic standards.

Thus the college is catering to the educational needs of all sections of the students in this agri/aqua based area. The college is fully equipped with science laboratories and is able to compete with leading Degree College in SPSR Nellore.

JKC:

Jawahar Knowledge Centre (JKC), a prestigious project of the Department of Higher Education, Andhra Pradesh, dedicated for skill development, was started in the college during 2008-09. Since its inception, JKC has been functioning well to equip the students with communication skills, reasoning and arithmetic skills, soft skills and to make them more

employable to suit the ever changing employment patterns By conducting on-campus and off- campus job drives, JKC is striving hard to provide employment opportunities for the students.

Since 2015-16, JKC has entered into an MoU with Tata Institute of Social Sciences, and is going to offer intensive skill development training.

MANA T.V:

MANA TV is an initiative of the Education department, Govt. of Andhra Pradesh that telecasts Educational programmes in tune with the students academic needs and demands of the job market . MANA TV regularly telecasts Educational Programmes to Degree students through Live and recorded presentations from SAPNET studios

PRR & VS Govt. College is also connected to the MANA TV. Some of the faculty are also presenters for live and recorded telecasts. The objective is to enhance the knowledge base of students and provide right skills and help students achieve their long term career goals.

YUVATARANGAM:

The students of our college, being highly spirited and enthusiastic, participate in youth festival programmes every year. This year our students participated in state level competitions like One act Play, Mono action and Kho-Kho, and Quiz programmes. Our students stood first in Group song and folk dance at district level and participated in the state event of 2015-16 academic year. Kho-kho team grabbed state first

HOSTEL:

The college hostel was started as student managed Hostel in 1976 and later in 1996 it was converted as College Attached Hostel. Now this hostel is converted into Departmental Attached Hostel and run by the Social Welfare Department.

Problems Encountered:

- Decline in admissions aggravated by intense competition from private unaided colleges and engineering colleges which are given the benefits of fee reimbursement scheme on par with govt. institutions.
- The College is located purely in rural area where the mode of transport becomes difficult and it is located away from the village.
- Majority of the students rely on hostel facility. Due to uneconomic strength of inmates and lack of amenities, the college is not able to run hostel for this academic year only.
- Majority of the students are partly engaged in agricultural work, seasonal fluctuation in students' attendance is of concern.

- **Action plan for future:**
- To start more number of need based restructured UG courses.
- To arrive at more number of MoUs.
- To involve all the stakeholders to derive maximum benefits to the student community.
- To establish two research centres dedicated for conservation of mangroves and aquaculture processing. And to serve more number of needy students.

Significance of RUSA in contributing to growth of institution:

RUSA will be highly significant in terms of remodelling the college to the changing needs of the present times.

Technicians of BMR hatcheries are exchanging their views on various aspects related to rearing of Prawns, Fishes, Crabs, and other aquatic organisms and the diseases affecting them.

i) **Research and Consultancy:**

Research committee is constituted in the college to initiate and encourage the faculty and the students to carry on surveys and research projects for the aspects of the local conditions. The students study projects are made part of the curriculum to inculcate

Zoology. Other faculty are also being encouraged to apply for research projects and seminars/workshops.

Free consultancy facilities are provided to the surrounding people who seek advice on various aspects. The Commerce faculty help the employees in preparation and filing of income tax returns.

Agriculture and Aquaculture are predominant in this area. The departments of Botany and Zoology offer their services to the needy people.

The department of Economics extends its services to the local administration by conducting enumeration services.

2.5. Finishing School Action Plan:

1. JKC provides number of training programmes to improve the communication skills among the students
2. Remedial classes are conducted before examinations for academically backward students.
3. Stipends and scholar ships are given to the S.C/S.T/B.C and E.B.C students

5. Coaching classes in summer are conducted exclusively to the outgoing students who appear for PG Entrance examinations and other competitive exams by Career guidance cell

2.6. PG programmes:

- No PG programme is started in this institution till now and this college is potential to start PG courses in Chemistry, Commerce, Telugu and English.

2.7. Training Needs Analysis:

- Faculty members regularly update their skills and enrich knowledge by undergoing training imparted Orientation course, Refresher course, Induction training offered by Academic Staff Colleges.
- One day/two day training programmes are conducted for Teaching staff by the faculty forum and IQAC on fundamentals of computers, Internet facilities, Making of Power Point Presentations, Consumer rights, RTI.

- Training will be conducted for non-teaching staff on computer skills and other administrative matters.

2.9. Relevance and Coherence of IDP:

DETAILED PROJECT REPORT (DPR)

3.1. Introduction:

a) Brief History:

PRR & VS Govt College was started as a composite co-education college in **1965**. It is located in **Vidavalur**, a remote rural area in **SPSR Nellore district**. It is the result of a Philanthropic gesture of the generous couple, Late **Sri Ponnaluru Ramachandra Reddy and Smt. Venkata Subbamma**, Landlords of Vidavalur. Right from the inception, till date the family has been showing very keen interest in the development of the college. From its humble beginnings in borrowed accommodation, today the college boasts of its own **permanent buildings constructed by the R & B department** in an ideal, sprawling pastoral location of about **12 acres, also gifted by the donors.**

b) Details of Affiliation:

PRR & VS Govt. College, Vidavalur was affiliated to Sri Venkateswara University, Tirupati since its inception. Later on in 2010, it came under the fold of Vikrama Simhapuri University, Nellore and now functioning as per its regulations.

c) Progress of institution since establishment:

This College was initially started in the campus of Z.P. High School, Vidavalur, Nellore Dt with a few temporary class rooms with asbestos roofing. As the college grew in all dimensions, the present building was constructed in 1989. The Government of Andhra Pradesh decided to bifurcate the composite colleges in the state (1997) and therefore the intermediate courses were separated and shifted to new building in 2002. Now this college is offering only UG courses for the students strength of 275 during this academic year 2015-16. After the bifurcation, the lecturers are able to devote their abilities to the full extent in imparting quality education to the UG students.

This college has recognition under 2(f) and 12 (B) of UGC act since 1991. At present the institution is affiliated to **VIKRAMA SIMHAPURI UNIVERSITY**, Nellore, Andhra Pradesh.

The college was one of the **pioneers** in introducing the restructured courses at the degree level and opted to start **5(five)** self funding courses in B.Sc (MPCs) B.Sc (Z.C & Ind. Fisheries)B.Com (comp &sp),Computer applications. These programmes provide ample Job opportunities. Even though there exists a great demand for these restructured courses, traditional courses like BSc (MPC), B.Sc (BZC) and B.A (HEP) had to be retained with a need to accommodate the rural poor youth. Among these courses B.Sc (fisheries) B.Com, B.A(ESCA) were completely lost their faces due to uneconomic strengths. Currently five courses are running in the college.

The college is situated in a rural area. Majority of the students hail from nearby villages whose parents are mostly illiterates and these students are the first generation learners. The cream of the students at the intermediate level goes for engineering and other professional

their level of understanding is low, bridge courses, Special orientations and coaching classes are conducted at the beginning of the academic year to raise such students to the required level of studies. Thus the college is catering to the educational needs of all sections of the students in this aqua based area. The college is fully equipped with science laboratories are able to compete with leading Degree College in SPSR Nellore.

JKC:

By establishing Jawahar Knowledge centre in the college we are able to create competitive skills among the students and develop communication skills by conducting group discussions, Seminars, Role play etc., from time to time.

MANA T.V:

Through Mana T.V programmes the students are being made to aware the latest techniques of teaching. The monthly programme schedules are displayed and circulated to the students and staff and the programmes are monitored by the lecturers of that subject concerned.

YUVATARANGAM:

The students of our college being highly spirited and enthusiastic participate in youth festival programmes every year. This year our students participated in state level competitions like One act Play, Mono action and Kho-Kho, and Quiz programmes. One student has won the third prize in the state level mono action competition.

HOSTEL:

The college hostel was started as student managed Hostel in 1981 and later in 1996 it was converted as College Attached Hostel. Very soon this College Attached Hostel is going to be converted into Departmental Attached Hostel and run by the Social Welfare Department

d) Current status of the institution:

At present the college has total strength of 275 students in which 194 are boys and 81 are girls. There are 19 teaching faculty members in which are 9 regular and 9 contract lecturers. There are 9 non teaching members. There are 9 class rooms for study, 1 principal room, 1 office room, 6 staff rooms, 1 ladies waiting room, 1 UGC net work resource centre, 1 electronic room, 1 library room including reading room, 5 labs, One college Department Attached Hostel that can accommodates 140 students. At present the conventional UG courses like B.A, B.Com (computer applications), B.Sc- (MPC,BZC) and restructured courses like BSc – MPCs are in existence. The pass percentage in academic year 2014 – 15 is 86% .The College is accredited with ‘B’ grade in the year – 2015 with a CGPA of 2.04.

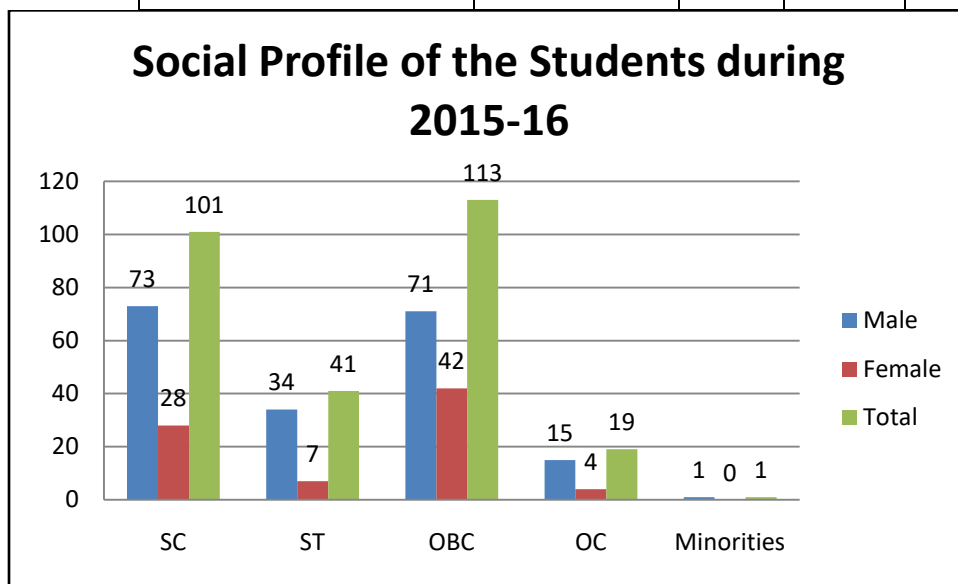

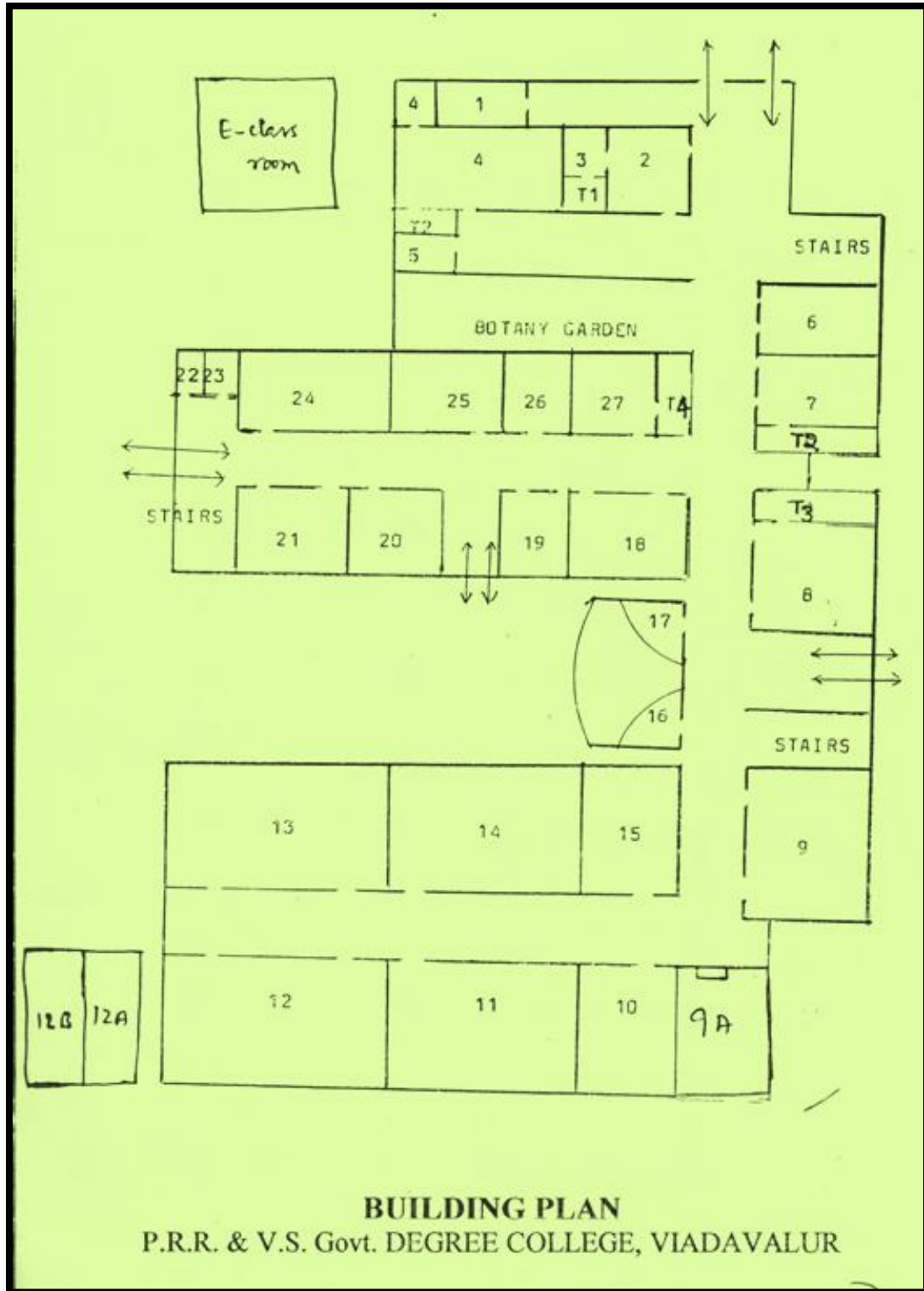

Justification:

a) New Academic Block:

As the existing academic block is not sufficient for increasing demands of teaching-learning space, it is proposed to construct a new academic block in the vacant land on the north-west corner of the existing structure. The existing class rooms need extensive repairs and electrification. Also, there is shortage of class rooms for science groups.

The proposed construction will have three technology enabled class rooms to benefit the institution to the changing teaching-learning methodology. To keep pace with other institutions, the adoption of ICT based teaching-learning is very much essential to provide such facilities to the students. Hence the proposal.

b) Seminar hall:

So far the college has no dedicated seminar hall. While organizing seminars and conferences, the college is facing immense problem for arrangements and accommodation to the audience. At present even seminars of national level are being conducted in the verandah/ corridor, with all amenities for projection, fans and lighting are temporarily arranged at the time of actual event. This is posing a great difficulty in organizing such events. Hence it is proposed to construct a new seminar hall with all facilities for 300 audience in the south-west part of the existing structure in the unoccupied ground.

Need & Justification:-

a. Renovation of Hostel buildings:

This Institution is a multi-disciplinary, Co-education College started in 1965 in a rural area to cater to the educational needs of rural youth who are deprived of opportunities for higher education.

Majority of the students hail from agriculture and fisheries background, coming from nearby villages facing a lot of difficulties in transport. As this is a coastal area,

expenditure for students, which is hard for them to bear with. Every year many students and parents enquire about hostel facility at the time of admissions and go back for want of hostels.

At present, there is a department Attached hostel. There is no proper dining facility, store room, water supply and toilet blocks. To provide accommodation for students, renovation of the existing hostel buildings is highly essential.

Due to non-availability of hostel facility, many of the students are being attracted towards private institutions. Hence establishment of college attached hostel is essential. Provision of hostel facility will help a lot of students to continue their studies and will also increase the admissions.

Hence it is proposed to renovate the hostel building to accommodate 50 students with an estimated cost of Rs.30 lakhs. Details of Engineering Estimates provided by APEWIDC are enclosed in the Annexure.

Renovation of Dining Hall and Kitchen

Presently this college has accommodation for hostel. The dining hall and kitchen require much needed renovation to provide hygienic food and comfortable dining. Running water facility is to be provided. Toilet block is not available for hostel students. Windows and ventilator panes are required.

b. Other Minor Works:

1. Leakage in slab

Water is percolating through the gaps in ceiling of the entire college building during rainy season. This is causing further damage to the entire structure. One or two pillars later erected are also damaged. As it is a load bearing structure, this will spoil the entire building in future course of time and this needs immediate attention.

Majority of the doors, windows and ventilators have been spoiled due to withering and termites. As security is a problem, the damaged windows and ventilators need repairs.

Computer Science Room:

At present accommodation for computer science department is insufficient. Increasing demands for more no. of systems requires more space. Hence, the need for expansion for computer lab and department. As the number of students opting for computer science courses is on rise, additional space for computer lab may be provided by shifting the adjoining library to the present gym block, and allocating the gained space for computer lab.

Flooring in the passage in front of computer science room:

Flooring in the passage in front of computer science room has sunk deep and it is problematic. Hence the necessity of repairs.

Note: Many of the systems are of low end configuration and there is immediate necessity of purchasing improved versions.

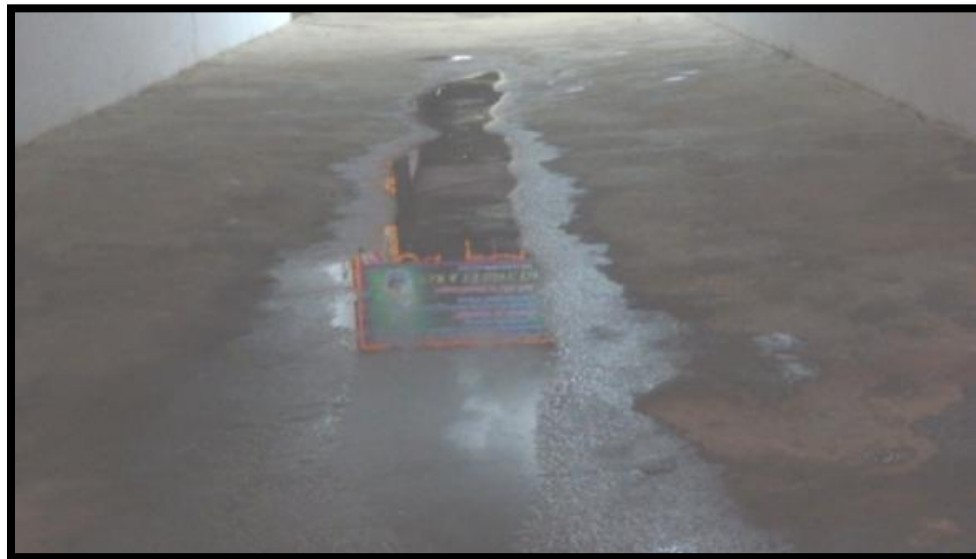


Image showing water logging in corridor during rainy season

5. Administrative building

a. Renovation of Office room

Leakage in ceiling has been a major problem. There is no proper ambience for smooth functioning. Also electrification is poor and there is need for provisions of cabins. Proper ventilation and furniture are required.

b. Principal's Chamber:-

Repairs to ceiling and provision of false ceiling and AC required. Conference ambience need to be created. Repairs in the anti-room, connecting the drainage to the outside are urgent requirements.

c. Corridor in the Science block:

Passage in the middle block (science block) has sunken and retaining water in rainy season. Consequent seepage of water into science labs has become a big problem for smooth running of practical classes.

6. Library

At present more than 40 thousand listings are accommodated in a small room and there is no stack area. Catalog section and issue section have no separate accommodation. The roof is leaking and part of the structure is damaged due to cracks. Illumination is very poor. Reprographic machinery need to be installed urgently. Hence, there is urgent need for repairs and expansion. Existing gymnasium block is suitable to accommodate library. Hence library may be shifted to the gym block by renovating the latter.

7. IQAC Room

IQAC is accommodated in a small room along with UGC resource center. The space is insufficient and congested, and both of them need separate accommodation. When there is requirement for presentations by IQAC, as required in times of Peer Team Visit, it becomes highly difficult to accommodate the dignitaries comfortably. Hence, there is need for urgent false ceiling and other repairs.

8. Class Rooms

Black boards and dias in all the classrooms require renovation. There are no fans in the class rooms causing in convenience to students in the summer. Illumination inside the class rooms is poor. Hence, it is necessary to provide these amenities in the classrooms. More over, 3 (or4) of the classrooms have to be renovated to convert them into E- Class rooms. It is proposed to arrange shutters to these class rooms to safe guard the costly equipment to be kept in the rooms.

- a. **Chemistry Lab:-** Ceiling of Chemistry lab is leaky and rain water stagnates in the season. The attached staff toilets are not useful. Balance room and lab are not sufficient and need expansion.
- b. **Botany Lab:** Cracks in ceiling window panes need to be repaired. Herbarium room needs to be created by partition.

- c. **Physics Lab:** Ceiling is damaged sunshades and flooring are damaged, stagnation of water inside the room during rainy season is a problem. Work tables need electrification (wiring).
- d. **Zoology Lab:**-Percolation of water through the ceiling, lack of window panes and ventilators are problems. There is no separate museum and the existing lab is very much congested and this needs immediate attention. Water is percolating through the gaps in ceiling of the Zoology staff room in the rainy season. It is difficult to conduct practical classes in rainy season. Hence repairs are proposed.

9. Renovation of MANA T.V room:

Presently the MANA T.V is functioning in electronic room in an isolated pocket of the academic building. This is insufficient to accommodate students when live presentations are telecast. Hence, it is proposed for renovation of the MANA TV room, in addition to provision of AC and false ceiling.

10&11. Gym

At present gym is located in small room, it needs expansion by removing the wall between the adjoining room and provision of power gym is also required. As majority of students are aspiring for jobs in police, army and other civil posts through sports and NCC quota, strengthening gym is urgently required. Also, erecting a wall between the academic block and the existing gym block will provide more space to accommodate more students.

12-18. Toilets

Toilet blocks in girls' waiting room and staff room are with poor running water facility. These do not have required amenities. There is urgent need to provide new basins, exhausts, lighting etc. There is urgent meet to connect the toilets in chemistry staff room and those in principal's anti room to a common sump for the sake of effective sanitation.

19. Campus Development

a. Beautification of Campus:

There is no proper ambience in front of the academic block. It would be highly beneficial for students if a garden is developed and seating arrangements are provided along with illumination for their studies in spare time. There is a need to arrange tree guards for prevention of newly planted siblings. Also, there is need for provision of flag stage in front of the academic block. Open land is occupied by weed species and problem of intruding snakes is a major problem for students. Hence, clearing the ground and development of structured garden/plantation is required.

b. Providing Drinking Water supply:

At present, an RO plant is installed by generous donation of the philanthropists. But this is not sufficient to satisfy the drinking water needs of 275 students. As the college is located at

when they come to the college. When it is exhausted, no proper alternative is available in the campus. Hence, there is need for provision of a water plant in the campus.

c. Electrical Wiring:-

Electrification was done long back as per the requirements at the time of construction of the college four decades ago. As time progressed, use of advanced electronic equipment has become imperative and the electrification is being modified as and when it is required. Over a period of time, wiring has become obsolete. It is not able to support the present day needs. Moreover, new e- class rooms, Wi-fi connection to the Campus, acquiring new computer systems are proposed. For the effective functioning of these facilities, renovation of electrification is necessary.

d. Pest Control:-

The college land is basically an agriculture land. Much of the open land is occupied by different plant species and weeds, clearing of which from time to time is a costly affair. The

soil is also very congenial for aggregation of termites. Consequently termite invasion has become a major problem for security of electronics, books and furniture. Pest control is done on temporary basis, but this is not adequate and a permanent solution is required. Hence pest control is proposed to be undertaken as part of renovation and repairs.

At present, the play ground is not well organized for daily games activity. Temporary play courts are drawn as and when required. Students have higher potentiality for traditional games like kabaddi and kho-kho. Many of the students are aspiring for careers in police and army. It would be highly beneficial for them to have running tracks and play courts. Hence, it is proposed foconstruction of play courts for kabaddi, kho-kho, shuttle badminton and running tracks on a permanent basis.
